## CYBER BULLYING

**BULLYING VS. CYBERBULLYING**  
 Cyberbullying differs from regular bullying in a few ways. It

- Often spreads faster than in-person bullying because of instant online communication.
- Has a wider audience because it can easily be sent to an unlimited number of people.
- Follower children home from school, so there is no escape.

**BREAKING THE LAW**  
 In Missouri, cyberbullying is illegal if it takes place on school property, at a school function, on a school bus, or using the school's technological resources (RSMo Chapter 169).

If cyberbullying occurs outside of these circumstances, it may fall under the legal definition of Harassment (RSMo Chapter 565).

**TIPS FOR PARENTS**  
 Make sure your child knows how to:

- Report cyberbullying to the school if the bully is another student.
- Collect evidence by taking screenshots or saving the messages.
- Report to the site/app/game if they are being bullied online.
- Talk to an adult such as a parent, teacher, counselor, coach, or trusted friend.
- Demonstrate care to someone who is being bullied.
- Work together against a bully by supporting each other.
- Not encourage it by joining in or forwarding negative comments.
- Stay safe by staying away from the drama, don't go to sites where people are cruel.
- Don't give up against cyberbullying, be creative and be positive.
- SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING!

**What is Cyberbullying?**  
 Cyberbullying is bullying by sending a message, text, sound or image using an electronic device. Children may commonly refer to cyberbullying as "online drama".

## Christian Food Pantry for November

At this time of year our supplies run very low. We often times have to go out and buy shelf staple items in addition to the meat, milk, eggs we purchase every week.

Our number of clients have swelled with the start of the school year as well. These are the number of people we helped every two weeks with food last month:

- 266 families
- 340 children
- 958 individuals
- 246 seniors



As you look at the list below, the items we need do change a little from month to month. We usually try to have about 1 - 3 months supply of all of our shelf staple items (three is our goal). So we have a critical need for the items listed below.

1. Entrees, like canned chicken, spam, ham, beef stew, etc- 2 weeks
2. Meal supplements like Rice a Roni, Knorr side dishes, Hamburger Helper- 2 weeks
3. Personal Care items like soap, deodorant, shampoo, cleaning supplies- 1 week
4. Canned Fruit- 1 day
5. Mac 'n Cheese- 1 month
6. Canned and dry beans- 3 weeks
7. Chili- 3 weeks
8. Cereal- 3 weeks
9. Pasta sauce or canned tomatoes- 2 days
10. Baking goods/ mixes- 1 week
11. Detergent- 2 weeks

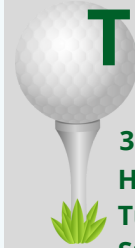
## Coat collection update

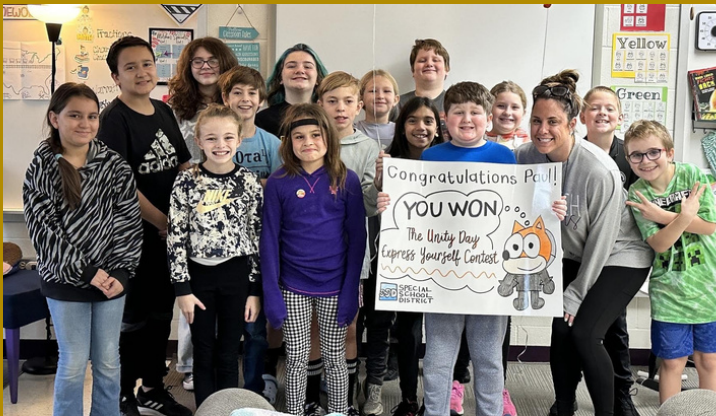

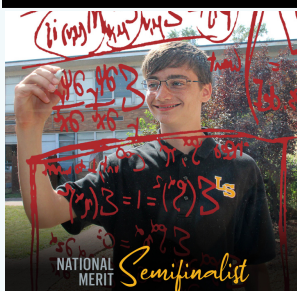

Senior Evan Solecki has been named a National Merit Semifinalist. He ranked in the top 1 percent of high school seniors in the state who took the PSAT last year.

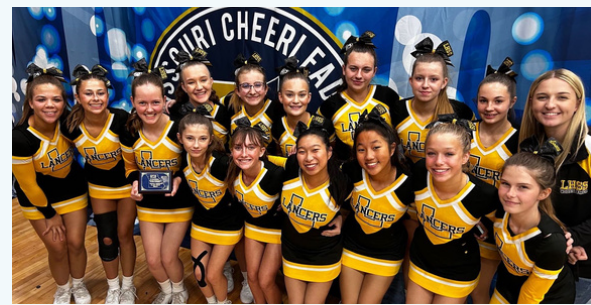
Senior Ryan Merz was named a Commended National Merit Scholar. Ryan, who scored in the top 2 percent of seniors in the state who took the PSAT last year.

Another, Scott Leiendecker, revolutionized the electoral process with the invention of the Poll Pad, while Terry Palisch holds several patents and has co-authored more than 50 petroleum engineering papers and Jim Mayer who played bass for Jimmy Buffett's Coral Reefer Band. The other inductees were Ted Schroeder, a nuclear submarine captain, Sharon Quick, an anesthesiologist who lobbies against medically assisted suicide, Jim Trulaske, who invented an advanced in-home treadmill in his basement and founded True Fitness Technology and Coach Linda McQueen who thanked God for opening up doors for her to compete in college and for allowing her to use sports as her mission field.

A highlight for many though, was Jim and his brother, Peter Mayer, also a LuSo Distinguished Alumnus, performing three songs, capping it off with a singalong to "All You Need is Love."
