COLD WEATHER TIPS

PROVIDE SHELTER for PETS

Bring all pets indoors
 Ensure pets have a warm blanket to lie on
 Ensure there is plenty of food and water
 Ensure antifreeze and bleach are out of reach
 Check under and around your vehicle before leaving as wild/stray animals try to stay warm there

RECOGNIZE the SIGNS

If your pet is shivering, whining, anxious or unusually slow, they are at risk of hypothermia

PROVIDE SHELTER and DRY BEDDING for LARGE ANIMALS



DRESSING FOR COLD WEATHER

adding layers will help keep you warm as the temperature drops

 1-2 layers
 long layer
 outer layer to keep out wind, rain

COLD
 2-3 layers
 gloves
 boots water proof
 warm hat

EXTREME COLD
 3+ layers
 gloves
 boots water proof
 warm hat
 face mask
 outer layer to keep out wind

WINTER RECREATION Essentials

BEFORE YOU GO

- Always check weather and snow conditions prior to your trip. Plan accordingly.
- Research the area and route you'll use. Some roads are not maintained in the winter. Bring a paper map and don't rely solely on GPS.
- Pack water, high energy meals, and snacks. Pack more than you think you'll need.
- Check road conditions and be prepared for winter driving.
- Tell someone where you're going and when you'll return. Check in when you get back.
- Dress in layers of warm, waterproof clothing. Bring extra layers.

ONCE YOU'RE THERE

- Maintain situational awareness, follow your map, and know where you are at all times.
- Stay on safe routes and avoid steep or dangerous terrain.
- Be respectful of others and share the "trail." When snowshoeing or hiking, avoid walking in ski tracks.
- Leave no trace. Pack out all trash, leftover food, and waste.
- Be sure to hydrate and eat frequently throughout the day.
- Pay attention to weather conditions and be prepared to leave quickly if conditions change or worsen.

Precipitation Types

SNOW
 The entire vertical layer remains below freezing, so precipitation that falls will be snow.

sleet
 As snow falls into a warm layer of air (above freezing), the snow will partially melt. As it enters a cold layer of air (below freezing), it will re-freeze into sleet.

freezing rain
 If there is a deep warm layer with a very shallow cold layer of air (below freezing) near the surface, precipitation will fall as freezing rain.

On Dec. 15, state representatives Bridget Walsh Moore and Michael Burton, as well as Shawn Cockrum and Paul Costigan of the Missouri Office of Refugee Administration, came to Bayless. They were there to tour the new English Language Development Welcome Center and BSD's renovated ELD classrooms.

The Welcome Center and classrooms renovations were done with money from the Afghan Refugee Impact Grant, a federal grant for districts helping resettle immigrants from Afghanistan fleeing the Taliban. Several BHS students were there to discuss their experiences with the representatives.

One of the students plans to become a doctor after he graduates, like his father was (his father worked with American forces during the U.S. involvement in the country).
