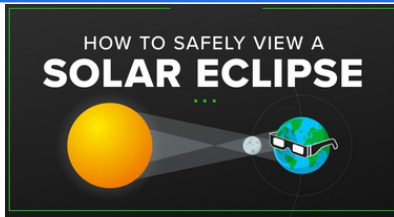

Hello Affton Southwest Precinct community, we are excited to report we have finally moved into our new Precinct, located at 11500 Gravois Road.

I'm sure you have watched the construction progress over the past year and a half, wondering when our move would actually happen. We had a successful Ribbon Cutting Event on Friday, March 15, 2024, where several Police Department employees, business owners, organization leaders, and members of the public attended.

We are still unpacking and making it our home, but let me tell you, we are very humbled and appreciative of this new building.

The precinct is built on 7.34 acres of land, has a large parking lot to fit over 120 vehicles, and the building is over 15,000 square feet. This large space is equipped with a community room to better engage our citizens, roll call area to better inform officers of crime trends, fitness room so officers can stay in good shape to better serve, locker room so officers can secure their equipment safely, and sallyport to help keep officers and prisoners safe.

Our Affton Community deserves this precinct building. We thank you for your continued support over the past several years and we look forward to better serving you. I appreciate your time and please be safe.

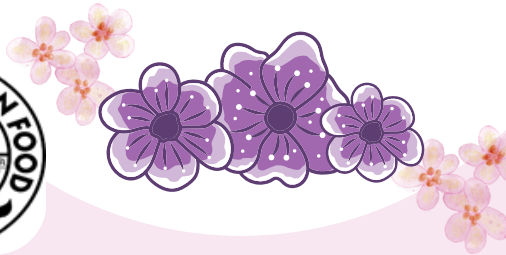

BHS STEM Team places second at WWT Forum

Bayless Early Childhood holds vehicle experience

Before spring break, the Itty Bitty Bronchos at Bayless Early Childhood Center had a morning of fun and exploration. One of the center's staff members organized a "Vehicle Expo."

The Affton Fire Protection District brought a fire truck, a driver for Prairie Farms brought a milk truck, Waste Management brought a dump truck, and several other community members brought large vehicles for the students to climb around and experience.

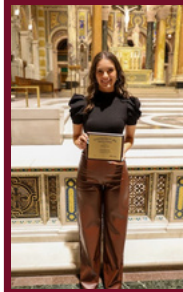
The Charger Basketball team earned fourth place in the Missouri Class 6 State Championship, Congrats Girls!

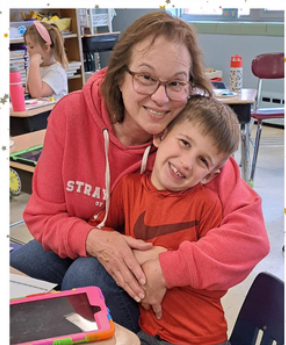
