On Tuesday, Dec. 6, Sheri Hogland-Brand, Gotsch Intermediate School fifth grade teacher, was recognized by the Affton Board of Education for receiving the Elbert K. Fretwell Outstanding Educator Award from the Greater St. Louis Area Council of the Boy Scouts of America (BSA). In addition, St. Louis County declared it Sheri Hogland Day.



Gotsch Intermediate School won first place nationwide in the 2022 Unwrap the Waves candy wrapper drive following Halloween. The purpose of this initiative was not only to ensure students and community members have a means to recycle their otherwise non-recyclable candy wrappers, but also to raise awareness of the large amount of single-use waste produced from a single holiday.

Gotsch students collected 36,715 wrappers and competed against over 70 schools across the country. In total, all the schools collected over 700,000 wrappers! As their reward, Gotsch will name the next rescued sea turtle patient that is rescued at Loggerhead Marinelife Center.






